DIGITAL INNOVATION IN INTEGRITY

Since October 2021, Square Circle Global Development Group have been working in partnership with TIPNG and five state agencies to develop internal Anti-Corruption Strategies.

Square Circle made it possible for all stakeholder meetings, document development and progress tracing, to be conducted virtually on an online platform.

It was only in May 2022, that we at TIPNG had our first in-person meeting with lead contacts at Square Circle, Dr. Kamil Shah, and Dr. Michael Spann, in Port Moresby.

state agencies lack integrity and anti-corruption strategies.

"The launching of the Anti-Corruption Integrity Strategy (ACIS) sets a significant milestone in the history and life of the NEFC. It is first of its kind for the NEFC since the inception in 1998. It has taken more than two decades, for the Commission to produce the Anti-corruption Integrity Strategy." These were the comments made by Mr. Patrick Painap, CEO and Chair of the National Economic and Fiscal Commission (NEFC), at the launch of their anti-corruption strategy on June 15th, 2022.

The pervasive presence of public sector corruption is often cited by state agencies as an impediment to delivery of services. However, despite this widely-acknowledged risk, almost all

The NEFC is the first of our five MoU partners to finalize and launch their anti-corruption strategy. Having worked entirely online with strategy consultants, Square Circle, since September of 2021 to develop this document, it was a moment of pride for the NEFC in the collective effort to publicly commit to addressing corruption.

The NEFC Anti-Corruption and Integrity Strategy 2022 - 2025 is comprehensive and has 4 key areas of focus: Strengthening and mainstreaming inter-governmental funding systems; Ensuring accountability, transparency and compliance; Promoting effective anti-corruption leadership and practice; lastly, Fostering anti-corruption culture.

This significant achievement for TIPNG'S PAIS Project is a national milestone that demonstrates that agency-level commitment to combatting corruption is possible. A digital copy of this strategy is available online for others that would like to learn from NEFC's experience.

PRIVATE SECTOR KEY TO NATIONAL INTEGRITY

The 2021 National Integrity System Assessment, found that the involvement of private sector in anti-corruption policy is limited however there is a readiness to engage via the Business Council of PNG and more recently a greater interest and commitment is being signalled. This observation was realised when TIPNG spoke at UNDP Workshop on Anti-Corruption and Integrity for Business Representatives in the Private Sector.

Mr. Peter Aitsi, TIPNG Board Chair, spoke on the need to the private sector to engage on anti-corruption offered to assist companies in setting up a whistle-blower procedure and code of conduct for their businesses.

This offer was in line with the Workshop discussion on best practices in anti-corruption policies, compliance, and awareness with focus on the development and implementation of anticorruption measures that can help prevent corruption in the private sector. A key outcome of the workshop, was the resolution to host more anti-corruption, and capacity building
