Renewing our accreditation this year to the Transparency International global anti-corruption movement, we are the boots on the ground and on the front lines in the fight against corruption in Papua New Guinea. Our primary role is empowering PNG citizens to act against corrupion through our research and programs.

Over the past 23 years we have been in existence, TIPNG has initiated a number of programs targeted at addressing corruption at various levels of PNG society, from the grassroots all the way to the house of parliament. The list of accolades we have won over the past two decades include championing a number of initiatives like the replacement of the "First Past the Post (FPP)" voting system with "Limited Preferential Voting (LPV)" in 2012; the passing of the "Organic Law on Political Parties and Candidates" in 2010 and the Open Government Partnership in (2018).
